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# **Intended Use**

The DiagnosticPRO *Edge* digitizer is used for making digital copies of medical x-ray film, including printed and radiographic film. The target users of these devices are medical professionals or trained staff for use as secondary capture images for consultation, review and final interpretation.

The devices are indicated for the digitization of mammography images for review and analysis, but not as the sole basis for screening or diagnosis.

#### Note:

The DiagnosticPRO *Edge* with ClinicalExpress or other DICOM standard software meets or exceeds ACR and DICOM standards for use of secondary capture images for consultation, review and final interpretation. Images captured as DICOM MG are to be used as reference or comparison only, and not for primary diagnosis.




## 2. Unpack the shipping carton.


a. Remove the accessory box.




b. Lift the digitizer, feeder box and foam end caps—together—out of the shipping container.




c. Place the group on one foam end cap. Lift off the upper foam end cap.



d. Remove the feeder box from the lower end cap.



e. Remove the digitizer from the lower end cap.



### 4. Identify important features

#### Power switch


The power switch is located on the front of the digitizer.



**CAUTION:** The digitizer power switch is used to disconnect the 24 volts from the external power adapter to the digitizer, and therefore applies power to and removes power from the digitizer only. The external power adapter is still a source of electrical current as long as it is plugged into an electrical outlet.

### Rear panel

View the digitizer from the rear to identify the USB port and power connector.






# Assemble the digitizer


Place the digitizer base on a table. Orient the digitizer base with the back toward you.
 Notice the two slots on top of the digitizer base.



2. Orient the film feeder with the back toward you (multi-film feeder is shown; single-film feeder is similar). You should be able to see the thumbscrew at the bottom rear of the feeder.




3. Insert the tabs on the bottom of the feeder into the slots on the digitizer base.



4. Tighten the thumbscrew to secure the feeder to the base.



5. Connect the multi-film feeder cable between the feeder and digitizer base as shown below.



6. Go to "Placing the digitizer on a table," the next chapter in this manual.

# Place the digitizer on a table

- 1. Select a working location for the film digitizer. Consider the following points when selecting a suitable location:
  - The digitizer is not intended to be used in a Patient Environment.
  - The digitizer can only be used on a desk, countertop, table or other physically stable surface not more than 36" (91cm) high.

#### **SAFETY WARNING**

The digitizer **must** be placed on mechanically secure horizontal surface, such as a desk or countertop not more than 36" (91cm) high and with no more than a 5° tilt.

The digitizer must not be placed on the floor.

VIDAR Systems Corp. is not liable for any damages or injuries to persons or property associated with improper placement or use of the digitizer.


- The digitizer must be within 6 feet (1.8m) of an electrical outlet.
- The USB cable must be able to connect to both computer and digitizer.
- The digitizer must be away from high traffic areas.
- 2. Place the digitizer in the location you have selected. Ensure the digitizer is stable (for example, it should not rock when touched).
- 3. Go to "Final assembly," the next chapter in this manual.

# Final assembly

## Connect the USB cable and power supply

**CAUTION:** Power the digitizer **only** with the power supply adapter provided by your Service Provider or Vidar Systems Corp.


1. Connect the USB cable to the USB port on the back of the digitizer. Do not connect the USB cable to the PC until instructed later.




- 2. Connect the power adapter's cable to the power connector on the back of the digitizer.
- 3. Connect the electrical cord to the power adapter.
- 4. Place the power adapter, power cable and electrical cord where they will not be a hazard.

# Install the exit tray

1. Slide the exit tray into the digitizer, keeping it high, then drop it down and slide it back toward you so the notches fit over the internal pins.



2. When properly positioned, the exit tray will protrude a small distance from the digitizer, and it can't be pulled out without lifting it off the internal pins.



# Install Device Drivers for Windows 7, 8, and 10

The USB driver is required for all installations to assure that the computer communicates with the film digitizer.

### 1. Apply Power to the Digitizer and the PC

a. Ensure the PC is turned off.

**Note:** Always apply power to the digitizer before turning on the computer. This enables the computer to recognize the digitizer.

b. Turn on the digitizer. The on/off switch is located on the front of the digitizer.



**Note:** The digitizer power switch is used to disconnect the 24 volts from the external power adapter to the digitizer, and therefore applies power to and removes power *from the digitizer only*. The external power adapter is still a source of electrical current as long as it is plugged into an electrical outlet.

- c. Observe the LED on the front of the digitizer: the LED should flash light blue for a little over 5 minutes. This indicates the digitizer is performing internal tests.
- d. When the LED stops flashing and remains solid green, proceed to step 2.

### **About the VIDAR Drivers**

The VIDAR driver is designed to provide compatibility between VIDAR DiagnosticPRO *Edge* Digitizers and Windows 7, 8, and 10 (both 32-bit and 64-bit). Features of this driver include:

- Installation/setup wizard for easy and consistent installation.
- Scanners and Cameras Control Panel (32-bit only), which provides a common interface for still image devices.

### 2. Install the VIDAR Drivers


**Note:** The computer must be running Windows 7, 8, & 10 Professional 32-bit or 64-bit.

**Note:** These instructions have been successfully tested on a wide range of Windows 7, 8, and 10 systems. In rare instances, you may have difficulty installing the VIDAR driver. If that happens, try again after logging on as Administrator, or as a user with Administrator rights.


You will need the VIDAR DiagnosticPRO Edge Digitizer Installation CD.

- a. Be sure the digitizer is turned ON and has a stable green light but that it is NOT connected to the PC. Wait until you are prompted to connect the digitizer to the PC.
- b. Turn on the PC.
- c. Insert the **VIDAR DiagnosticPRO** *Edge* **Installation CD** into the CD-ROM drive. Browse to the CD and double-click on *19090-003 VIDAR\_Driver\_6.1 Online Install Package.exe* on the CD to install the driver.


d. In the first screen, click Next >.




e. In the License Agreement screen, activate I accept the terms of the license agreement, then click Next >.







g. The Setup Status screen will appear. Wait while the files are installed.




h. When prompted "Would you like to install this device software?" Click Install. When installing on Windows 7, 8, & 10, 64 bit the name will appear as Jungo



i. When installing on Windows 7, 8, & 10, 32 bit the name will appear as VIDAR



j. InstallShield will indicate that installation is complete. However, the driver installation is not complete.




k. Earlier, you connected a USB cable to the digitizer. Now, attach the connector on the other end of that cable to a USB 2.0 or 3.0 port on the computer.

**Note:** Wait 30 seconds after you connect the digitizer before you launch the VIDARINFO program. This ensures the computer has recognized the new hardware and has installed the driver properly.


- 1. On a 64-bit system:
  - 1. On the desktop, double-click the **VIDARINFO** icon.




2. The window shown below will appear. This indicates that the digitizer is communicating with the computer.



- 3. Click "OK" if the Digitizer Information is present on the Screen
- 4. 64-bit system only: In the Windows 7, 8, & 10 Computer Management window, the digitizer is listed under Jungo.




- 2. On a 32-bit system:
  - 1. Start > Control Panel > Scanners and Cameras.
  - 2. In the device window, <u>right</u>-click **VIDAR Film Digitizer**, then click **Properties** in the pop-up menu.
  - 3. In the **VIDAR Film Digitizer Properties** window, click the **VIDAR Properties** tab. If the driver is properly installed, the properties will appear and if the digitizer is ready to digitize its serial number will appear. If **Not Ready** appears the digitizer is normalizing.



#### Note that:

- The digitizer will report as "VXR-12" for backward compatibility.
- You may not see the same firmware and hardware version as shown in the window above.
- The serial number will not report if the digitizer was just powered on.

- 4. Click **OK** to close the properties screen.
- 5. 32-bit system only: In the Windows 7, 8, & 10 Computer Management window, the digitizer is listed under Imaging devices.



The digitizer is now ready to operate. Please refer to the "User's Guide for DiagnosticPRO *Edge*" for operating instructions.

You may need to install other application software to run the digitizer.

**Note:** While the digitizer works with both 32-bit and 64-bit versions of Windows 7, 8, & 10 it only works with 32-bit image processing applications.

# Appendix: Electromagnetic guidance

Caution: Medical electrical equipment.

EMC (Electro Magnetic Compatibility) must be considered before any medical electrical equipment is installed or put into service. Follow the information in the accompanying documentation when installing and operating the DiagnosticPRO *Edge* Digitizer.

Caution: Using the Digitizer adjacent to or stacked with other equipment may cause interference between the equipment. Before utilizing stacked or adjacent equipment, verify proper functionality of all equipment in the actual configuration in which it will operate.

Caution: Connecting the Digitizer to equipment that is not rated CISPR 11 class A or class B may alter the electromagnetic characteristics.

Caution: In a domestic environment this product may cause radio interference in which case the user may be required to take adequate measures.

# Guidance And Manufacturer's Declaration – Electromagnetic Immunity - Input a.c. power Continued:

- a) The test may be performed at any one power input voltage within the ME Equipment or ME SYSTEM RATED voltage range. If the ME EQUIPMENT or ME SYSTEM is tested at one power input voltage, it is not necessary to re-test at additional voltages.
- b) All the ME EQUIPMENT and ME SYSTEM cables are attached during the test.
- c) Calibration for current injection clamps shall be performed in a 150  $\Omega$  system.
- d) If the frequency stepping skips over an ISM or amateur band, as applicable, an additional test frequency shall be used in the ISM or amateur radio band. This applies to each ISM and amateur radio band within the specified frequency range.
- e) Testing may be performed at other modulation frequencies identified by the RISK MANAGEMENT PROCESS.
- f) ME EQUIPMENT and ME SYSTEMS with a d.c. power input intended for use with a.c.- to d.c. converters shall be tested using a converter that meets the specifications of the MANUFACTURER of the ME EQUIPMENT or ME SYSTEM. #### Immunity to proximity fields form RF wireless communications equipment

The ENCLOSURE PORT of ME EQUIPMENT and ME SYSTEMS shall be tested as specified in Table A using the test methods specified in IEC 61000-4-3.

The frequencies and services listed in Table A are representative examples that are based on RF communications equipment in use at the time of publication of this collateral standard. The test specification does not attempt to cover every frequency and service used in every country. The RISK MANAGEMENT PROCESS should take current communications services into account. Testing should be performed at the additional frequencies identified that are not represented in Table A.

While communication might not be possible when ME EQUIPMENT that includes radio equipment is tested in its bandwidth, the ME EQUIPMENT or ME SYSTEM shall still be able to provide its BASIC SAFETY and ESSENTIAL PERFORMANCE.

The Manufacturer should consider reducing the minimum separation distance, based on RISK MANAGEMENT, and using higher IMMUNITY TEST LEVELS that are appropriate for the reduced minimum separation distance. Minimum separation distances for higher IMMUNITY TEST LEVELS shall be calculated using the following equation:

$$E = \frac{6}{d} \sqrt{P}$$

Where P is the maximum power in W, d is the minimum separation distance in m, and E is the IMMUNITY TEST LEVEL in V/m.

If the ME EQUIPMENT or ME SYSTEM complies with the higher IMMUNITY TEST LEVELS for this test, the 30 cm minimum separation distance (per above table) may be replaced with minimum separation distances calculated from the higher IMMUNITY TEST LEVELS.

a) The carrier shall be modulated using a 50% duty cycle square wave signal.

b) As an alternate to FM modulation, 50% pulse modulation at 18 Hz may be used because while it does not represent actual modulation, it would be worst case.
